II. Presentation: <u>Stepping Stones Perinatal Program</u>

Jacob Read, Senior Program Manager, and Ashley Lowenhaupt, Supervisor, Butte County Behavioral Health, <u>provided a presentation</u> about Stepping Stones outpatient perinatal substance use disorder services.

The next <u>Stepping Stones graduation is scheduled for April 18 from 10 am to noon at the Elks</u> <u>Lodge in Chico</u>. Community partners are welcome to attend to celebrate the success of caregivers who have successfully completed the program. Stepping Stones also welcomes support and participation in their weekly classes and groups from community partners. III. Presentation: Butte County Maternal Child Adolescent Health

Evelyn Jones and Rachel Miller <u>provided a presentation</u> about Butte County perinatal data. The presentation had a primary focus on rates of perinatal substance use. Rates of alcohol use during pregnancy have declined. Tobacco use during pregnancy is 3.5x higher than the state rate, and 7x higher for those with lower than a high school education and/or living in high poverty communities. Prenatal cannabis use is 3x higher than CA, and Butte has the 3rd highest rate in the state behind Humboldt and Shasta. Butte Neonatal Abstinence rates are 6.6x higher than CA and appear to be highest in the state overall. Butte is the 5th highest county in the state for postpartum depression.
